Proposed On-Campus Stadium Student Body E-mail Sent Tuesday, April 17, 2012

Students-

For the rest of you - Until a couple weeks ago, we only had four factual pieces of information related to the proposed on-campus stadium project, all directed by President Tony Frank from the beginning when the concept was originally unveiled: 1 - Protect the Intramural Fields and green space by not building there; 2 - Protect the views to the west; 3 - Project will be privately funded, no student fees, tuition, tax dollars will be spent; and 4 - Be conscious and consider the impact to the surrounding community. At the end of March, the Stadium Advisory Committee (comprised of representatives from all areas of campus and the Fort Collins community) met to discuss further details on the proposed stadium and report back to the community some developments in the product feasibility studies. There were a couple hundred folks in attendance at the meeting last week, only a handful of which appeared to be students. The four subgroups of the Stadium Advisory Committee reported their workings back to the group. These included Site Selection, Design/Best Practices, Market and Financial Analysis, and Public and Campus Engagement.

http://www.colostate.edu/stadium. At this point, we have proposed site locations for the stadium, some preliminary public engagement information, and information on what possibly could be included in the design of this facility. Take a look at the reports - they are really interesting reads.

Now that we are at the point where we have some preliminary information to take in, process, and formulate questions and comments

- we need your opinion. We need you to think about the information related to financials of the project, potential sites where this stadium could be located, and what might go inside it. And we need you to share that opinion with us. We have heard a lot of verbal comments from students about their opinions, but it is time to get that data on paper so I can bring it to the committee.

PLEASE respond to my e-mail with your thoughts and/or a simple "build it!" or "save Hughes Stadium". I have also attached a survey link to this e-mail with more in-depth questions for those willing to take a few minutes to respond. ASCSU will be on the Plaza several times throughout the rest of the semester with some simple forms asking for written comments. We will be contacting student organizations for comments. It will also probably be in the Collegian regularly. You know what - if you made it this far into the e-mail and respond with your comments on the proposed stadium project, I'll give you a Frontier Airlines gift card. Stop by my office (LSC Room 109) to pick it up.

There is no cut and dry answer to the role of athletics in a public University, but I am confident that whatever the outcome of this project is, at least the process will allow all to be heard. -eric

*SAVE HUGHES STADIUM!!!!



*I think overall an On-Campus Stadium is a terrible and ill-thought idea. It makes no sense to abandon a football stadium that we have spent money renovating recently and that is still perfectly functional. By bringing the stadium on campus we will be disrupting many students and creating more problems for ourselves in the future.

- 1) By moving the stadium on campus you bring a lot of noise and traffic onto a small space. Students who don't want to go to the game or want a quiet day in their room studying will be forced to endure cannons, screaming fans, and loud speaker systems/music. This is not conducive to getting your homework done on a busy Saturday afternoon. Also the traffic that comes onto the stadium (both walking and driving) will be distracting, especially for people who live on the first floor of their building. I can see lone girls being harassed by people walking by their window if they have a curtain open. If you expect them to just close their curtains every weekend for the games, then you are taking away a natural light option for them and wasting energy unnecessarily with turning on the lights. This has the potential to make students uncomfortable in their own living spaces, which no one should be subjected to just to appease an Athletic Director and money hungry President. Also, we would be subjecting anyone studying at the library or any nearby community members to the use of cannons (if we were able to score). Or do we propose ending that tradition as well? We also can already see how badly the vehicular traffic gets backed up from people coming to our basketball games. At least when our football games cause traffic back ups it is on Overland, which is not a busy street by any stretch of the imagination. By bringing these games on campus you will block up many of the major streets in the area, which many community members use including College Ave, Shields, Prospect, and Laurel. This does not just affect the students.
- 2) The proposal calls for a potential location in the current locations of Edwards and Ingersoll Hall, or Newsom and Aylesworth Hall. All except Aylesworth in this list are halls that provide a cheap alternative to housing on our campus. Ingersoll and Edwards in particular have just had money poured into them in order to spruce them up a bit. By building a stadium there you are undermining the new windows, carpet, sprinklers, wireless internet, landscaping, and other various fix-ups that have been implemented on these buildings. Given that the number of community style living halls are slowly dropping or being encroached upon (as the business department is doing to Allison Hall) where exactly do we propose to give discounted housing to first year students? Additionally, we are at a maximum for housing beds at the moment. The last couple years we have beds overbooked at the beginning of every school year. Given the projections for student application rates increasing, I don't see this problem just going away. By getting rid of 2 entire halls we are putting ourselves at a serious shortage. Where will be build these new halls (since we shouldn't ruin the view or the green space)? Will athletics being reimbursing housing for the monetary value of the halls they are usurping? Or are we expecting housing to raise their rates at an even steeper rate and make college even less affordable to future students.
- 3) The proposal also suggests using the Z-parking lot South of the Academic Village structures. Again, this will be actively close and disruptive to students, especially in a complex that holds Honors and Engineering students. One of the appeals of AV for many students who live there is the environment. This will be utterly ruined every time there is a home game if a stadium is put right on their doorstep. Also, parking already is terrible on this campus. We pay a ridiculous amount of money every year for a parking pass that doesn't even guarantee you get a spot anywhere near where your class is. That Z lot is always at least half full even on the least attended days. By



taking that parking space away we will exacerbate an already troublesome parking conundrum. During the summer Housing has the conference season. This season brings in a significant amount of income for the Housing and Dining departments to make renovations and improve student life on campus. These conference goers come here expecting to get First-Rate treatment and that kind of treatment does not involve having to park half a mile or more away from the building they stay in. I wouldn't go spend money at a hotel that I had to hike in to and out of every time I needed to use my car. A veritable small army of students is employed every summer by Housing and Dining to staff these conferences. By discouraging conferences from coming here in years to come we would be decreasing the availability of summer jobs for students and taking away the opportunity for a very good leadership experience. I have heard that they are thinking of building another parking garage to compensate the loss of that lot, but why would we reinvent the wheel when we already have one that works perfectly well. For being so green we sure seem to be consuming a lot of materials and using a lot of gas guzzling construction equipment to create spaces that we already have.

4) Finally, we are putting a lot of faith in this stadium doing a lot of things for our athletics that are not guaranteed. I seem to remember when the indoor practice field was being built that we as a campus were told it would make a big difference for our football team. I have yet to see how THAT has helped. The amount of money it would take to sustain an ever growing athletic department would also be a huge drain on resources that could be going to increasing research and our academic reputation, things that actually have a chance of influencing future generations and making this world a better place. I understand at this current time there may be an option to sustain the department on alumni support and not student fees, but when we over-tap our alum for money for athletics we can't also turn around and ask them for more money for academics. Our academic donations WILL suffer from this. Without those donations a lot of the projects that help students learn to be successful in the world would not be possible, and that would be a big disservice to the students of our community. The potential for athletic scandal will also be increased as we have seen for a lot of the big conference players (Duke, CU are the most recent ones that come to mind). By increasing the prominence of our teams we are also increasing the likelihood one member of the team who misbehaves will end up splashed all over the media. We saw just this last week how the whole team was smeared by the Actions of Capi and Orakpu. We made it to national news briefly for the treatment of our freshmen. We also made it to the media for our mega-party and the fact that our football players were in attendance there. Do we really want to escalate this?

In sum total, I believe putting this much emphasis on an athletics department and an on-campus stadium is ill-advised. The locations chosen for the stadium all pose a myriad of problems and the disruption to campus life is guaranteed. We are doing a great injustice to our amazing Veterinarian program, our phenomenal Engineering department, and our scientifically prestigious Sciences.

*I'm a landscape architecture major, and I've been looking at some of the plans on the Stadium Advisory Committee website. I think that in each proposed area, there is going to be a huge problem with traffic moving into and out of the campus, not to mention the fact that all of the surrounding



roads would become extremely congested. Even if students walked, there would still be problems due to Alumni and others coming to view the game. The people of Fort Collins who aren't students would have to deal with this awful traffic right at the heart of Northern Fort Collins every time there was a game.

My opinion is that we should just renew Hughes. It's in an awesome part of Fort Collins with a great view, and it's far enough from campus that any of the congestion from traffic can usually be avoided easily by people who aren't going to the game. It's also very historic, and knocking it down or leaving it to fall apart would be a tragedy. There is always plenty of parking at Hughes, and students who choose to Tailgate don't run the risk of doing something stupid and hurting others because they are much farther from central Fort Collins.

*I have a number of concerns regarding the building of a new stadium on CSU's campus. First, allow me to preface my concerns by sharing that I am a Fort Collins native, and love both my city and CSU, and think of the two as inextricably linked as a community. I also love CSU athletics and am a die-hard supporter of the football team through good times and bad and have grown up attending games at Hughes Stadium.

That said, my first concern about the proposed on-campus stadium regards the "private funds" used to fund the project. Will said funds also cover the cost of rebuilding and relocating any buildings or parking lots dislocated by the stadium? The ever increasing cost of tuition increases has stretched my personal budget to its limit as it is (I pay my own way through work and loans). The thought of having to build, say, two new parking structures or new student housing angers me in ways I cannot adequately express. The amount of construction over the past decade has been disruptive in the extreme, with far too many projects that do not effect me whatsoever as a student. I am still particularly upset when I think about the uprooting of the on-campus tennis courts to make room for the Indoor Practice Facility. Despite the soothing words coming from Tony Frank and Jack Graham about the use of private funds, I know better. Ultimately, the cost to rebuild displaced dorms, academic buildings and parking lot will fall to the already beleaguered students to pay for out of pocket. Also, one of the proposed sites is right on top of the horticulture gardens and our awesome little mini-forest. Are they daft?? This university is rooted in agricultural tradition!

Another concern is the cost of policing events and campus security. How much funding will come out of state or students pockets to provide adequate safety to campus and the surrounding community during games? Traffic alone will be a complete nightmare, effectively shutting down the center of Fort Collins with College and Shield avenues brought to a screeching halt. This is to say nothing of the effects of thousands of drunk, angry or passionate students pouring out of the new stadium. Perhaps people are quick to forget CSU's rich tradition of rioting? Frankly, this proposed stadium seems like a logistical security nightmare for the combined CSU and Fort Collins police departments.

In the end, I am disappointed that the new administration at CSU is placing so much emphasis on having a high-ranked football team. For me, CSU has always stood for top-notch academics and excellent research. From solar cells to tuberculosis cures, CSU has been steadily approaching a reputation for becoming something of an MIT of the West! Now, however, it seems like the student body and the provision of an excellent academic experience has taken back seat to pleasing sports hungry alumni. Let's use those private funds to further enhance our veterinary, engineering and business colleges! How about a new visual arts or foreign language building instead? Why not attract



more top-tier professors, or fund more high profile research ventures? In the end, football is just a game. Our academics have the potential to change the world! Hell, take those funds and apply them to the cost of tuition for a few years instead of the inevitable hike in student fees!

Thank you for taking the time to look over the concerns I have, please keep seeking student input about this project!

Thank you for taking the time to actively engage the student body in this manner. As someone who is personally invested in the outcome of this matter, I do have a vested interest complete with a great number of opinions.

In the interest of keeping this message brief, I will outline just a few.

I should start by saying that I am the manager of the Student Sustainable Garden at Plant Environmental Research Center, and therefore more than a little concerned about the proposed placement of the new stadium. As the last agricultural land on campus, I am shocked to realize that this area is not considered "green space" by the planning committee. Any number of research projects (some of which are even supported by the student sustainable garden) are conducted on this land, and it is every bit as valuable an educational tool to Colorado State University as the intramural fields.

On a more universal note, I share the concern with many students, faculty, and community members that placing too great an emphasis on athletics will stagnate the quality of the academic programs at Colorado State University. By no means am I undermining the importance of athletic programs at the university level. Of course a strong athletics program provides innumerable opportunities for many students, both athletes and not. However, the value of a research university is ultimately measured by the quality of the research that it is conducting. I would like to see some evidence or a financial plan that ensure that a there will not be a disproportionate emphasis placed on the athletics program that will lead to a stagnation in the funding of research, graduate studies, quality faculty ect.

Finally, I fear that the planning stages of this project are moving at an alarming rate. I would like to see a long-term plan, that is backed up with evidence to suggest that construction of an on campus stadium is really the most constructive move that the university can make. I would like to see everyone involved in this decision taking more time to carefully evaluate the costs and the benefits. This issue was just brought to public in February, and the final decision is set to be made in August. With so much at stake, six months does not seem like nearly enough time to take into account every factor that might be at play.

I urge you, ASCSU, and every person involved to really consider this matter from every angle before making any rash decisions.

Here are my thoughts on the on-campus stadium; (1.) Good incentive for future students, (2.) Proposed site being the South-West part of campus, (3.) Additional issues with the on-campus stadium.

- (1.) In my opinion, having an on-campus stadium will influence a greater number of students to come to the game (given that the student tickets remain free), which could serve positively to the football team and Colorado State University's football program. This might also serve as an incentive to new Colorado State applicants. An on-campus stadium is aesthetically pleasing and may increase overall school spirit.
- (2.) There is very little space that could be used for the on-campus stadium. Given that the "View to the west" wants to remain open, that makes an on-campus stadium almost unattainable because of the number of buildings on the east side. Therefore, I propose that somewhere between Summit hall and including the 240 'Z' lot would be the best location.



(3.) Having an on-campus stadium brings up many other problems that require a solution. Parking is a big problem around campus and if empty space is taken up by a stadium, not a parking lot, this might not sit well with the students. At the same time, the on-campus stadium has the potential to create additional parking spaces (with the possibility of a raised stadium). An on-campus stadium also has the potential to cause more congestion to the central part of campus as well as the surrounding streets, I do not have any suggestions on how to fix this, I just know it could be an issue.

Overall, I am all for the on-campus stadium and I am excited to see what will be the final decision.

*I'm against the proposed on campus stadium for various reasons but am currently interested in something I picked up from the survey.

In the question about the location of the stadium, the text mentioned that several of the sites are currently occupied by buildings and that they would be relocated if the stadium were selected to be placed there. If this were the case, how would the relocation of said building be financed?

I am hopeful that this would also be privately funded, but am interested to know if this was included in the estimated cost of building a new stadium, and if not I believe it should be.

*Hi Eric,

I'm a second year graduate student in the Dept of Atmospheric Science. When I moved here, I knew that the athletics success at CSU had not been great recently, but I've attended many CSU football, volleyball and basketball games regardless. I enjoy the games and enjoy supporting my school.

I did my undergraduate work at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. In the past 10-15 years, Wisconsin has been consistently nationally ranked in football, men's basketball and men's hockey, among others. The venues nearly always sell out, with 80,000, 18,000 and 15,000 fans, respectively. Money from donors (myself included) rolls in and new and improved venues are built. This was not always the case, however. In the 1980s, the Wisconsin football team was dreadful and fan attendance at the on-campus stadium was very poor. People showed up for the band more than the football team. It wasn't until a new coach was hired and the team actually started winning (e.g. the Rose Bowl in 1993, 1999 and 2000) that people started showing up, donations increased and new facilities could be built (new basketball and hockey venue in 1998, expansion of football stadium in 2005).

That said, I don't think having an on-campus stadium is necessarily a bad idea. However, I don't think it is a guaranteed catalyst for gaining fan support either. Although I admit I don't have as close a connection to CSU as I do to Wisconsin, having grown up in the state and attended school there for 4 years, I do care and hope the Rams succeed. My opinion is this: A new, successful football coach has been hired. Wait a few years to let him built up the program and get back to actually winning games. Then reassess the feeling on campus. If the team is winning, I don't think there will be any problem getting students and fans to travel the two miles to Hughes and donations will easily



come in. Maybe building an on-campus stadium now would help, but it's also possible that it won't. Winning first, not new facilities, gains support.

*The thought of building another stadium is idiotic. Why would a university that prides itself on being green waste millions of dollars and a million tons of raw materials to build a new stadium, when the university already has a perfectly good one. As addressed above, this money is coming from private donors. - art stadium would be an upgrade from Hughes. I'm not against Hughes entirely, but no one can deny that a new stadium would have countless improvements (including other features, such as a stores), that would serve fans better and draw interest from recruits.
- Community view The other comment I hear from a lot of opponents is that we don't need a new stadium, and that it's a waste of money. Again, the money aspect has been debunked. The way I look at the necessity of it is this: No, we don't NEED a new stadium, but if any department on campus was given the chance to build a new, better facility, they would do it in a heartbeat. And while a football stadium is bigger than say a chemistry building, the community's input is not needed to build a building on campus (although I think it's good that Frank and Jack Graham are trying to be transparent and open to hearing the community's thoughts).
- Wait until we earn it I've been at CSU the past five years, and have spent all 23 years of my life in Fort Collins. I love the town and bleed green and gold. I agree that there are many more deserving teams, programs and student-athletes to receive an upgrade of this magnitude than a football team which has gone 9-27 over the past three seasons. However, the time is now. First, as Frank has stressed, the football program--not any other team--is what draws national exposure to the university (and not just athletics). It's the moneymaker for CSU, no matter how poor the performance on the field is. So is the football program as deserving? Maybe not, but it's where the focus needs to be. Additionally, we can't wait until we "prove we can win". With conference realignment and shifting changes, we need to show our commitment now, so we don't get left in the dust when we earn it.

Thanks for your time, and listening to my thoughts. I'm excited for this new era in CSU athletics, and the idea of what an on-campus stadium can bring to the community and alumni base. I have read through many e-mails sent out by our president Tony Frank and others and I have a few concerns I hope you can address. I am currently a freshman at CSU, almost completely here on scholarship, so you can imagine how a potential money sink for the university would worry me. I understand Tony Frank has promised he will not be using public funds for this project. I also



understand raising enough private funds will require a lot of time and effort on the part of Colorado State employees. Does this mean there will be less time for employees to gain money for scholarships and such?

Also, I noticed on the map of potential places for the stadium to be located there are almost always residential or academic buildings. Will the budget for the stadium also pay to "relocate" these buildings? And if a residential building is taken out, where would that be placed to ensure that there is enough housing for incoming students that is close to their classes?

In addition, there has been a lot of talk about how much this stadium will increase Colorado State's presence in the athletic community. A shiny new stadium is not everything; athletes must work very hard to be competitive on a national scale. Will a new stadium mean more money to support the training of our athletes in the form of equipment, coaching, and recruitment? I am unsure how much undergraduate tuition costs at CSU, but I can assure you that the Professional Veterinary Medicine program tuition is putting hundreds of students a year into debt that it may take up to 25 years to pay off.

*It's comforting to know that no tuition dollars will be spent on this project. However, it is difficult for me to understand how a person or organization with such incredible financial resources as to be able to spend money on a 100% unneeded stadium can sleep at night knowing the financial distress that many undergraduate and graduate students are currently facing. If this donor was really looking out for the well-being of the student body, they would put the money where it is actually needed: into scholarship funds that can benefit students who are trying to better themselves by completing a degree.

Another concern that I have over the idea of building this stadium on campus is that there is already limited parking for the buildings that we currently have. Have you tried getting a parking spot for the new Rec Center during peak hours recently? Since removal of the parallel parking spots in front of the Rec Center, there is only one (rather small) Z pass parking lot within a reasonable distance from the gym. Building a new stadium will require a lot of additional parking, something that CSU seems to already have a difficult time facilitating. Also, if a residence hall is removed to facilitate more space for this new stadium, that only puts more of a financial burden back onto the students who will have to find housing off-campus. Finally, as if the traffic in Fort Collins isn't already frustrating enough, especially around the campus during morning and afternoon rush-hours, this stadium will undoubtedly exacerbate the heavy traffic during game times. * I applaud you and ASCSU for being more interactive with the student body on the topic of a proposed on-campus stadium. However as grateful as I am of you conducting this survey, I have reservations regarding the impact of the student voice. I won't pretend to know the breakdown financially of what contributes most to running this university. Of course, as students paying tuition we are a large part of the financial flow. There is no doubt there. Yet, one can safely assume that another large portion of funding comes from outside donors and alumni. From my personal perspective, I feel as if with such heavy stakeholders in play here I don't have much faith in our president as standing his ground if the majority of the student population disagrees. Although I



think highly of Tony Frank, I have strong concerns as to how much of an impact the student voice may have here compared to the alumni/donors. One may simply dismiss this concern, placing faith in our president but why not give it some thought? It's not out of the ordinary to have doubts that Tony Frank would turn away copious amounts of money that would be going towards his university, whether academic or not. As president of the student body, I hope that you can make the concerns known of those individuals making up the student body – this being one of them. I'm sure I'm not the only individual to voice this specific concern.

As far as whether or not to build the proposed on-campus stadium, I am strongly against it. Colorado State University has been my home for three years now and have loved every minute of it. As it was initially branded "The Green University", since being here I have learned of the many ways that it does not live up to this title. In my 4 years at CSU (and I was a part of ASCSU for a bit too) I never saw someone in office work towards goals and actually help the administration. Thanks!

* Thanks for all the work you are doing for CSU, and I really appreciate you going out of your way to learn how students are feeling about the stadium. I think we need to focus on building facilities for the CSU institutions that actually bring us visibility. The CVMBS college, for example, provides a great deal of notoriety academically, and the sub-sciences within this group (Microbiology, Biomedical Sciences, Environmental Health) etc. are all located in very old, shabby looking, technologically limited buildings. One of the largest majors on campus, Health and Exercise Science, doesn't even have it's own facility. We literally have a one-of-a-kind environmental toxicology program...which nobody has heard of, based partially on the lack of funding for professors and facilities keeping it limited to a very tiny program. Our Veterinary and Occupational Therapy graduate programs are nationally famous, and yet the sciences that provide the necessary background for such a career are all lacking in facilities and funding.



Although CSU attracts many students with our athletics, we also attract many with our academics. When students come to visit, they are persuaded by a nice building where they can begin their science/art/history/natural resource academic careers- not a shabby old dark building. I wish that this discussion wasn't revolving around "athletics" because it really seems to be about the football team. We have very nice training and playing facilities for a majority of the sports at CSU. Hughes stadium has its cons, but there is nothing about it that stops the football team from winning. The argument that having a new stadium will automatically turn the team into one that can win some games and therefore attract bundles of money and students just doesn't make sense to me. If the football team can show us they deserve brand new facilities and new funding, then great. A new football stadium isn't going to get us into a new conference..the sports teams who participate are. As of right now I think we need to focus on what currently makes us an attractive and successful university, and fund the departments that are stuck in old buildings and with limited budgets. * I believe that academic institutions have a moral responsibility- an obligation- to put the quality of our education and research as well as the health of our community above the bottom line. The bottom line should only be maximized as a means to maximize these ends. Of course, there are pressures in our world that make these practices unavoidable on some level, and having no experience with this sort of decision making myself, I can only imagine how difficult the juggling must be in order to find and keep the balance.

However, from my perspective, for what it's worth, this is a huge business venture being run towards irresponsibly and enthusiastically with dollar signs and pretty buildings in the eyes. I, nor some experts (of which I am not), am not convinced it is even a well-conceived notion, and where the money comes from makes no difference to the sensibility of the idea, nor to the financial obligations the venture brings us into. Starting out on this venture could easily be a first giant step onto a slippery slope- leading to waves of decisions that must necessarily be made from this purely financial perspective in order to continue to support the decision to build the thing. And on top of that, the financial ties made from the proposition will inevitably be one more pressure affecting decision-making somehow in the future.

But, either way, even if it does turn out to be financially sound, I have a hard time believing that the impact that the financial gain would have on the quality of CSU would somehow be enough to counter the impact of taking our focus further away from academics, research, and community service.

I believe the entire philosophy being spouted in support of building the strongest possible athletics department that preaches that the greater the athletics program, the greater the school is just plain false. Not that I don't recognize the kernel of merit to it, but it is quite oversimplified and then being



used in a successful attempt to justify and spread the expensive tastes of a small faction of the university.

I believe it would be responsible to allocate the funds available for the stadium to these more academic and this being a university, more relevant matters. My second concern regards the athletic department itself. This year has been particularly turbulent with the replacement of a new athletic director and new football coach, both of which allegedly would provide the department, and specifically the football team, with a better team environment. However, the team environment has deteriorated significantly, as is evident in the three separate fights that team members have been involved in throughout this academic year. I do not claim to know who is blameworthy in each instance, but I do know that fights are never started purely arbitrarily both sides are usually responsible to some degree. Many of these team members are already receiving scholarships to cover tuition, free meals (like the training table), and free tutoring so that they can pass classes. In other words, they are treated better and are given more resources than the average CSU student. Further, less than 20 student athletes across all sports received an award for earning a 3.0+ gpa last semester. This indicates to me that there is an unhealthy environment in the department itself, where academics take a back seat to athletics, facilitating a mentality of desert rather than of individual accomplishment and accountability. 



